Long Live King Jesus

ne of the truly emotional moments of my childhood came while watching The Lion King on one of those rainy days when we were kept in the classroom. (Some context might be needed here. Remember, I grew up in San Diego,



where rain was almost as rare as it was in ans 15:55-57: "Where, O death, is your Noah's day.) With the rain running down the window seals and water flooding the four square courts outside, I remember sitting and watching King Mufasa desperately try to rescue his son Simba from the peril of a restless stampede. As Mufasa claws his way to the top of the ravine - his son Simba now safe - he is met by his brother Scar, who grabs hold of him. Scar proclaims with his sinister and sly voice, "Long live the King," shoving Mufasa backward to his death.

Scars' words are borrowed from the realm of European monarchs, dating back several hundred years. When a King died, it would first be declared, "The King is Dead." This proclamation would be quickly followed by the announcement, "Long Live The King!" This second proclamation concerns the succeeding monarch. The thought was that the Kingdom could not exist without a King, so at the death of one King, their successor must be declared.

Watching The Lion King was the first time I heard these words. It remained the only time I heard them until September 8th, 2022, when Queen Elizabeth died and King Charles III assumed the throne. Upon her death, it was declared, "The Queen is Dead. Long Live The King."

Now, picture Peter, standing before the masses on Pentecost, boldly proclaiming, "Let all of Israel be assured of this: God has made this Iesus whom you crucified both Lord and Messiah" (Acts 2:36). Or recall Paul's unflinching words in 1 Corinthi-

victory? Where, O death, is your sting?' The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." What are the Apostles doing? With each word, they are driving home the undeniable reality that Jesus now reigns triumphant over death. They are declaring, in essence, "Death is Dead. Long Live King Jesus."

Now, admittedly, this all sounds strange to Americans who think in terms of democratic politics, where the ruler is determined by votes. It's easy to assume Jesus is like a politician vying for our approval. Yet, Jesus doesn't draw His authority from our endorsement but from triumphing over all other contenders for control over us. This underscores the profound significance of the resurrection. Without question, we are all subject to death – which is inevitable for each of us, regardless of our approval. Yet, through his death and resurrection, Iesus ascends to the throne.

Thus, in a world plagued by fear and uncertainty, Easter is a call to embrace hope, defy the shadows of despair, and surrender everything in allegiance to King Jesus. Death is Dead. Long Live King Jesus. • Chaplain Jon Nichols
