

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Abiding in Christ

magine standing before a black-smith's forge, the air thick with heat and the smell of burning coal. In the heart of

the forge, an iron rod glows intensely, almost blending into the flames surrounding it. The once cold, lifeless metal now radiates with the fire's



As the iron stays in the fire, it absorbs the heat and light, becoming something more than it was. Yet, no matter how long the iron stays in the fire, it will never become the fire. The moment the iron is removed from the fire, it starts to cool and lose its glow, quickly returning to its original dark and cold state.

This powerful image illustrates the Christian life. We are called to become like Christ through our union with God. As we remain in God's presence, we are transformed by His holiness and love, reflecting His character and glowing with the light of Christ. Jesus said, "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing." (John 15:5). Similarly, just as the iron takes

on the heat and glow of the fire without becoming the fire, we share in the glory of God through our union

> with Christ. However, this glory is not ours—it is God's.

Yet, when we distance ourselves from God's presence,

like an iron removed from the fire, the warmth of His love and the brilliance of His holiness fade within us. Jesus reminds us, "Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me." (John 15:4).

Therefore, let us be encouraged to remain and abide in Christ, for in Him, we find our true identity and purpose. As we immerse ourselves in His Word, in prayer, and in fellowship with other believers, we draw closer to Him. Jesus promises, "If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you." (John 15:7). This promise calls us to stay connected, live in His presence, and glow with His love and grace. • Chaplain Jon Nichols
