## Natasha and Ramon's Story

Newlyweds Natasha Tworek and Ramon Ruiz have been living at Open House Ministries for the past eight months. Life is looking up, but it wasn't always.

The couple was plagued by years of addiction and homelessness. In addition, Ramon was close to death because one of his heart valves was compromised due to a blood infection. He underwent open heart surgery and a valve replacement, and received a pacemaker.

"I was addicted to meth, and Ramon was addicted to meth and heroin. Then, his health took a really bad turn for the worse. Everything was falling apart," says Natasha.

Ultimately, the couple's three young children were taken away from them.

"We lost our apartment and lived with friends. They were evicted and we were on the streets. Eventually, we were just exhausted and strung out, and ready for a better life," says Natasha.

Natasha's mother encouraged the family to move from California to Washington to be near her. Spots at Open House opened up, and Natasha and

Ramon started the program immediately.

Today, the couple is working hard in the Open House program including outpatient addiction classes, Bible studies, chapel, job training, parenting classes, and counseling sessions. Learning to love, accept and trust God is also moving them toward complete healing.

"Honestly, every staff person is wonderful and caring. We love Pastor Mark so much and



Jodie is our amazing case manager. Even the residents are supportive and helpful. They understand our path since they've been there and help us learn and move through our journey with Christ," says Natasha.

Pastor Mark married the couple this past

April in a blessed ceremony and reception on the Open House campus.

With the help of God, Natasha and Ramon have been reunited with their children. Both are gainfully employed and the family is now looking for permanent housing as their Open House journey comes to an end.

"Open House continues to strengthen us in the Lord and teaches us how to be better people. It's the most amazing place I have ever been. My kids love our new life with Jesus and having sober parents," says Natasha of 8-year-old Chris, 6-year-old Alejandro, and 5-year-old Adrian.

"Anything is possible with Jesus and love of life," says Natasha.



# Yearning

#### Chaplain's Corner - July, 2019

My wife and I recently welcomed the arrival of our newest grandson, Jude, to our family. We watched attentively as he tuned into this strange new world, which in

turn, began to imprint images into his very soul. We engaged with this treasuring of new life and enjoyed the deep waters of love cascading within us.

This deep yearning is a type, an example, of God's affections for us. I was widowed in 1995, when my late wife Audrey died after a seven-year illness. Facing the prospect of parenting 8-year-old and 7-yearold daughters, I was more than overwhelmed. I prayed, "Lord, I barely know how to father, and I do not know how to mother these girls." In response, He taught me via Psalm 103. Here, the theme of God's steadfast love is repeated, while God deepens our view of His love for His children.

God's yearning toward His children is seen in the Hebrew

word, rehem, translated as "compassionate, merciful and gracious." In I Kings 3, King Solomon faced two women arguing over who was the mother of one baby boy, after another baby boy died in the night. Solomon's wisdom was masterful: He ordered to literally divide the baby between the two women—

using a sword! Hearing this edict, the real mother relinquished her son to the other woman, out of compassion, mercy and grace (rehem) for the baby's very life.

Solomon now knew the real mother. And this word, rehem, reflected God's vearning for my daughters, too. It is both paternal and maternal.

This loving image of God's yearning is foundational to Open House Ministries. Far too often, generations of families have been greatly influenced by brokenness in God's family.

Even as the doors opened at 11:00 a.m. there were a number of eager attendees gathered for the annual **Growing Hope Together** luncheon at Warehouse 23 in Vancouver. This is the single largest fundraising effort of the year to help Open House Ministries cover the expenses of the services we provide.

Upon entering the event center, guests encountered large displays of the major ministry components at Open House, including Wheel Deals Bike Shop, Second Hand Solutions



Thrift Store and Common Grounds Coffee Shop. Even some of the children were involved, demonstrating their awesome dance moves learned through Dance Evolution.

Further into the building were dozens of fantastic raffle prizes on display with enthusiastic, hopeful winners lined up to purchase

and deposit their raffle tickets for the drawings held during the luncheon.

As they enjoyed the joyful atmosphere of the occasion, two of the attending community members were asked about their reasons for participating in the festivities. Both

replied that they, "Love supporting Open House because it is an effective way of giving back to the community in so many different ways."



In all, 289 tickets

were purchased by community members along with volunteers and staff of Open House. Those present enjoyed a delicious meal of salad, roasted salmon filet with sweet chili and grilled asparagus over house made rosemary au gratin potatoes. The desserts were house-made carrot cake and berry panna cotta with lemon. As good as the lunch was, however, the presentations which followed were arguably better.

The new video called "Growing Hope Together" was played for the audience. Throughout the video, the mission and vision of OHM were demonstrated by real

people who were beneficiaries of God's grace delivered through the selfless efforts of the many staff and volunteers who serve at Open House.



Keynote speaker Launda Carroll and staff member Leslie Cook delivered moving testimonials about building hope in the lives of others through the use of our individual gifts and the intervention of Jesus. Launda emphasized that: "Hope



is greater than loss, and faith is bigger than fear." She went on to explain that those present at the luncheon joined together to "build hope in the lives of those who come to Open House."
