
## Breaking the Cycle of Homelessness!

# John's Story

"I have a new-found relationship

with God. I am now able to be

present when my family needs me

and that is priceless," ~ John

For many years, John had a wonderful, full life. He had a loving wife, three beautiful children, nice home, reliable cars and a very good job as a plant foreman for 17 years.

Quickly, the Washougal resident's life spun out of control.

"I started hanging around the bars with the wrong crowd after work. Drinking turned into doing hard drugs and partying which eventually led down a path of destruction," says John.

John's lost everything. His wife and his two teenage girls left him. Then, he was fired. John began living in a trailer.

"I really didn't care if I lived or died. I was using drugs all the time and they became the only thing important to me. I was so alone, heartbroken and hopeless," added John.

John received a blessed and unexpected surprise—the birth of a son—but the child was taken into CPS custody at four months of age, which broke John's heart.

"When my son arrived, I saw a glimmer of hope and happiness. During my first visit with him, I just held him and kissed him, and promised to bring him home," says John.

Right then and there, John knew he had to change his ways. His adult daughter offered a safe, drug-free place to stay while he fully committed to his recovery by attending treatment meetings, counseling and church parenting classes.

"My daughter told me about Open House and I thought it would be a great place for me and my son. I waited one year for a spot to open up, and it has been one of the best things to ever happen to me," he asserted.

Thanks to Open House programs and staff, John learned to pay off old debt, opened a bank account, saved money and became a law-abiding citizen. He even recon-

ciled with his oldest daughter and her family, and got to meet his young granddaughter.

"I have a new found relationship with God. I am now able to be present when my fam-

ily needs me and, that is priceless," says John.

After successfully completing the program, John now works at Open House full time and his son lives with him.

## Loving Witnesses

Denver as a team member on a 30-bed psychiatric unit. Samaria (Luke 9:51ff). Yet it was John who was a first-I witnessed the crucial interactions of so many people hand witness of the quantum changes in the Samaritans in that Community, and still today recount how deeply we impacted one another. A myriad of memories flow of simple conversations which offered witness to Life

in an unexpected and forgotten place.

"You shall be my witnesses, in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). These geographic locales represent concentric circles of influence in the lives of followers of Jesus quite literally from nearby to faraway—even today. Our Jerusalem may be in our home, our family and our neighborhoods. Judea might well be our community, county and region. But

Samaria was and is a tough assignment—literally going to a place that was off-limits to the devout: a place of alleged degradation, immorality and wayward religion.

The word, witnesses, speaks of one who announces Good News, by one who has been changed by Jesus. Once upon a time, the followers of Jesus were thunderstruck that He would hang out with a woman with questionable credentials at a well in Samaria (John 4:1ff). Amazingly, the apostle John had actually asked Jesus for

## New Mentoring Program Launched at Open House

During a recent visit with Jodie Baxter, Case Manager at Open House, she was searching the bulletin board next to her desk for a couple of feedback comments among dozens of photos, cards, and letters about success stories she's been involved with. She found two notes written by recent young graduates of a new program which was launched at Open House in the fall of 2018. Each one echoed a similar sentiment... gratitude for the caring, personal connection with a mentor the program provided them.

This new resource is called "Teach One to Lead One"

(T1L1) which is a community mentoring program that teaches Universal (Biblical) Principles to lead participants into lives of purpose and potential. As Jodie explained, "At Open House we have a heart and passion for

Through four trained staff mentors, T1L1 uses a range of activities and exercises to impart the 10 core principles of Respect, Integrity, Self-Control, Compassion, Courage, Teamwork, Excellence, Humility, Enthusiasm, and Honor. The first session included six students from 5th through 12th grade and six parents. All twelve successfully completed the 12 week course which is tentatively scheduled to be held twice per year. The program can be



modified to include other age groups depending upon the needs of the residents at any given time.

T1L1 is yet another tool in the Open House toolbox to equip those we serve with the skills and knowledge to pursue full, productive lives through the power of the Lord.
