## **CHAPLAIN'S CORNER**

## A Father's Blessing

oon we will be celebrating Father's Day. As chaplain of Open House Ministries, I enjoy spending time with the dads staying here as they work hard to rebuild their families and gain new life-skills for their futures. Together we reveal the power of God's blessing in Christ, and through it, understand a father's role.

One of our Bible study classes covers how our view of our *earthly* father relates to our view of our *heavenly* Father. This topic often reveals deep wounds. Tony, a former resident, struggled with issues related to his father's time in prison. "That does it!" He said, "I am turning into my dad, the very man I never knew. It is up to me to stop this cycle and ask God to break the chains of my past!"

Oftentimes, wounds caused by fathers define young men. Consider the Biblical story of Jacob. Born of Isaac, Jacob struggled behind his brother Esau for his father's blessing. Broken relationships followed Jacob until the night he wrestled with God to gain the *Father's bless*ing. (Gen.32)

At Open House Ministries, we steer into issues of fatherhood, identity, responsibility, and legacy. Most important, we work on our relationship with our heavenly Father. The Bible teaches us foundational truths, and if we do not know what a good father is supposed to be, we cannot accurately define our *birth* fathers or ourselves as fathers. Only God can heal old wounds and set us free through His son, Jesus, to reflect Him in our generation, *and the next!* 

I have been blessed to know many dads at Open House Ministries who have found faith in Christ and turned their lives around. A young father and former addict, Doug came to our shelter an angry agnostic. While reading *A Case for Christ*, Doug's heart was changed by God's healing touch. Transformed, today he is a great dad. Oscar, a single father at the shelter, loves the Lord deeply. This same deep love has compelled him to reconcile with his own dad. JT is a former resident who found new life in Christ. A single father of two adult

sons, JT now takes his call to lead seriously. God, our Father is faithful.


