CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

A Father's Day Message

f we were to list the defining characteristics that mark Jesus' prayer life, chief among them would be the way he addresses God as Father.

"Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name" (Matthew 6:9)

"Abba, Father, everything is possible for you. Take this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will" (Mark 14:36)

"Father, the hour has come. Glorify your Son, that your Son may glorify you" (John 17:1)

"Father, into your hands I commit my spirit" (Luke 23:46)

Yet, Jesus is not the first person in the Scripture to speak of God as Father. It is God himself who first refers to himself as Father. When instructing Moses what to say to Pharaoh, God says, "Then say to Pharaoh, 'this is what the Lord says: Israel is my firstborn son, and I told you 'Let my son go..." (Exodus 4:22). This a revolutionary declaration. To a people whose identity had been reduced down to that of "slave," God calls son. To a people who had lost all hope for a life beyond mere survival, God offered them a future and the hope of salvation.

For God to refer to himself as 'father' is not an attempt to be relevant to earthly people. Nor is the fatherhood of God a projection of human qualities on God. Rather, God is called 'father' because traces of his nature are given and reflected by earthly fathers. Paul expresses this in Ephesians 3:14-15, "For this reason I kneel before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name." Here the (continued)

Greek word for family (patria) is derived from the Greek for father (pater). The point is that family and fatherhood derive their very name and essential nature from our heavenly Father.

Now all earthly fathers no more perfectly reflect the heavenly Father than all humans perfectly reflect the image of God. We are all flawed, broken, and sinful. Some of us have had bad fathers. Some of us have been bad fathers. This is not an excuse. It is an acknowledgment that while our family tree is bent and broken, the roots are soaked in the grace and mercy of God our Father.

It is a privilege to be called 'dad.' It is also a great responsibility. I'm grateful for the men in my life who have modeled the heart of the Father.



The pastors, mentors, teachers, grandfathers, and neighbors who spoke into my life. Yet, most of all, I'm grateful for my father, a man who could say, "Follow me as I follow Christ." He taught me it is possible to be tough in this world and tender toward God. And although he is a perfectionist, taught me much more by the way he humbly deals with his flaws and failures.

Thus, one of the great joys of my work at Open House Ministries is helping the dads here to walk in the shadow of their heavenly Father. To stand tall and take responsibility for themselves and their families. To not cast blame when things don't go right. To exercise healthy authority in their children's lives. And to serve their families by leading as an example of love.
