hen Jesus encounters blind Bartimaeus, he asks, "what do you want?" He asked this of others, including his own disciples. You never see Jesus ask, "What do you know?" Or even an open question like, "What do you believe?" Jesus wants to know what we want because we are what we want. We live in the direction of our love. As author James K. A. Smith writes, "Our wants and desires are at the core of our identity, the wellspring from which our actions and behavior flow." We learn this from Jesus when he taught, "No one can serve two masters. GENEROUS GIVING

Support Open House Ministries and reduce taxes

n 2 Corinthians 8:2-3, Paul wrote about a group of believers whose joy at what God was doing overflowed into generosity as they joyously took part in God's work through their giving. Being generous with what God has entrusted to us is also honoring Him as being a wise and faithful steward.

Does seeing the life-changing work OHM is doing in helping to change the lives of homeless families for eternity fill you with that overflowing joy? If so, we encourage you to consider giving to OHM. If you're 70½ or older, then a charitable rollover from your IRA may be a great way to partner with us. You will pay no taxes on transfers up to \$100,000 with a direct transfer to OHM, it will satisfy your RMD (required minimum distribution) and it will reduce your taxable income even if you don't itemize on charitable gifts. Another consideration is that if you desire to remember OHM in your estate planning, your IRA may be one of the best options since a charity can receive a gift from your IRA without any tax consequences but your children and/or others named as beneficiaries would have to pay taxes on an inheritance from your IRA.
