THRIFT STORE UPDATE

Blessings Emerge at Secondhand Solutions

hese days Secondhand Solutions is bustling with activity. Since its reopening last June, Manager Amanda Goforth has been adapting and staying focused on keeping everything running smoothly. "A lot of adjustments had to be made to reopen the thrift store during COVID. We originally came back with very reduced hours, reduced capacity (10 people in the

store at a time), operating with a reduced team," she said. "We increased cleaning and sanitizing, and put up signage to remind shoppers to stay socially distanced. Residents were unable to come in and work to keep the store from becoming too crowded."

Accepting donations required a whole new process too as safety precautions became paramount and picking up donations in neighborhoods had to be put on hold. Since reopening, the store has been receiving six, in-kind donations per day, and they are picking up donations in the community again with enhanced safety measures in place. Store capacity has also increased to 20 people, and management is bringing back resident workers and volunteers. "Just this last week

we were able to re-open on Saturdays, making it our first full week since returning last June," says Amanda. "At the time we thought it would last at most two weeks. Little did we know, that over a year later we would still be adapting to our new normal." (Continued)


THE LOSS OF A FRIEND
