


MAY BLESSINGS

Mysterious and Miraculous

here are a number of powerful stories about women in the Bible. Women, led by the Spirit of God, spoke boldly and acted with great courage. Women like Ruth, Deborah, Miriam, Queen Esther, Hannah, Elizabeth, and Mary, the mother of Jesus. Each of them has much to teach us about walking with God. None of these women were perfect, and there is incredible grace in that truth. The trap of comparison and the condemning lie of shame that says "you are not good enough, smart enough, or strong enough" erodes the goodness of the gospel, which declares that God calls imperfect people, saves imperfect people (despite their imperfections), and He entrusted His words, His plans, His work into the hands of imperfect people.

We celebrate the reality that God calls and saves sinners. Yet, it has been my observation that we tend to scratch our heads that God entrusts sinners with his work. Why would God do this? I wonder this every time I reflect on the incarnation of Jesus. God the Father entrusted Jesus—God the Son—to an imperfect human mother. Oh, how amazing is the grace of God. We are not only saved by grace; we live, serve, and walk by grace.

Womanhood and motherhood are many things. Many of which I can't even begin to understand and whole-heartedly put in the category of mysterious and miraculous. When I asked our residents what motherhood means to them, this is how the women responded:

66 Being a mother is not an easy job, but it's my job. It is the job God has blessed me with even on days when I question, 'How am I a mother, God?' It's a blessing to have the responsibility to teach them about God so that one day they will step into their full potential for what God has for them."



- Being a mother means the world. It's having a beautiful innocent piece of myself that I get to help shape, teach, nurture and protect. I'm so grateful that I'm getting to be a part of those everyday little moments. So many unforgettable memories. Some frustrating, some cute and special. Some are just genuinely funny. It's the most real thing I've ever done, and at times it's so hard, but I wouldn't exchange it for anything."

- Being a mother means no matter how you're feeling— some days even like giving up— the Lord Jesus holds your hand and gives you strength to carry on."

As I listened to these reflections, one word came to mind; ministry. Motherhood is ministry. It's a calling and a holy one. One that God, in His grace, has entrusted to women.
