Meet Lorelei Steuben



Helping children learn about healthy dental care is important to Lorelei Steuben. As a dental hygienist, she sees first-hand how taking care of your beautiful smile can make all the difference, not only for confidence but also for your health.

That's what inspired Lorelei's Every Smile Is Priceless project. She has launched a fundraiser with America's ToothFairy, participating in a matching program for dental necessities. I have chosen to donate to Open House Ministries because more than half of their residents who stay there every night are children," states Lorelei.

Seven Reasons for Thankfulness

We had a tradition in my home growing up that maybe you shared as well. Every year following Thanksgiving dinner everyone had to share what they were thankful for. No one got to sit this out. Even the children banished to the children's table had to come over and share.

In the spirit of being grateful, I thought I would share seven reasons why I'm thankful to know and be known by Jesus. I hope that in doing so your soul might be moved to join me in worship and reflect on your own reasons.

- 1. I am thankful Jesus is a relentless redeemer. He doesn't allow the brokenness of my past or this world lay in ruins. He is constantly (and in all things) working for the good of those who love him. He is active in rebuilding and restoring what has fallen apart.
- 2. I am thankful Jesus is a patient teacher. I stumble. I fall. It often takes many attempts to see change through in my life. In fact, there are still lessons I'm learning and relearning. He does not scorn my effort. He gently keeps showing me the way.
- **3. I am thankful Jesus is a loving King.** Jesus radically redefined love and leadership by laying down his life for us. He did not delegate or demand

of us work to make his burden lighter. Rather, he took ours upon himself so that we might share in his life.

- **4.** I am thankful Jesus is a faithful friend. I don't have to wonder if he will leave me or reject me. I have no reason to fear if he will be true to his promises. I don't have to question his commitment to our relationship.
- **5. I am thankful Jesus is a safe refuge.** Life is bumpy. It is hard. It can feel like a juggernaut. In those moments I know where I can run that is free from judgment, full of grace, and strong enough to hold me and allow me to find rest during the storms.
- **6. I am thankful Jesus is a generous victor.** Jesus did not return from the grave seeking vindication from his enemies. He returned vindicated and made the gift of life available to all.
- 7. I am thankful Jesus is an awesome God. There is this feeling that accompanies an amazing sunset or standing on the edge of the Grand Canyon. It is the feeling of awe and wonder. It is the feeling of terrifying amazement. It makes you feel small and grateful all at the same time. It is what I'm feeling right now as I reflect on the greatness and grandeur of God. Due to an increased standard deduction, many individuals and couples will no longer be able to claim itemized deductions. However, a tax-free IRA charitable rollover offers the following benefits to individuals age 70 ½ or older:

- The ability to direct a current, outright IRA gift, up to \$100,000 to Open House Ministries or other qualified charities
- Satisfaction of the required minimum distribution without increasing taxable income
- No loss of a charitable itemized deduction
- Ability to direct your gift to any area of our operations
- It's easy, simply notify your IRA custodian
