he Adopt-a-Room program at Open House Ministries was formed in 1995 by a generous group of sponsors who identified the need to furnish newly constructed shelter units. The goal was to make each residence a welcoming place for families to stay while they work on rebuilding and restoring their independence.

Today when a family completes our program and moves on from the shelter, a room sponsor steps in to make the unit ready for the next family. Open House Ministries has been blessed over the years with many generous groups and individuals, committed to helping new residents get a head start with basic household needs.

"I give thanks daily on my family's behalf for the adopters not only investing in our future, but creating a home and foundation for us," said Kailee. "When we came in to our apartment for the first time I felt a complete sense of home and belonging!"

At this time we are in need of help with room readiness for families moving in. Each unit requires household items everyone needs to set up a home. Bedding, bathroom necessities, cooking and kitchen essentials, cleaning products, and dishes are all part of the OHM Adopt-a-Room Wish List refined over the past 25 years.

Like many programs at Open House Ministries, Adopt-a-Room has been undergoing changes to meet current COVID safety requirements. Limited access to the shelter makes it necessary for items to be dropped off with our team, allowing them to organize units and add the finishing touches for new families.

Most units require less than \$1,000 to furnish and set up.
